WHAT'S NEW City Archives Share Community Records

Did you know that Coquitlam of City Archives house records of people and organizations from our local community? Canadian Municipal Archives are unique compared to archives in other countries, because they acquire and house community records alongside municipal government records. This is known as the Total Archives concept (developed by the Canadian archival community in the 1980s), as a strategy to document all aspects of Canadian society. A large portion of Coquitlam Archives' collection is comprised of community records.
