## Salmon Come Home

#### Celebrate the annual fall return of salmon.

Witness the return of chum, chinook and coho salmon to the creeks where they spawn after living most of their adult lives at sea.



Every year the number of salmon who return varies. You may see the following:

**Chum:** Early October to mid-November. It is easier to see chum as they are large and spawn in lower reaches of the creeks and rivers. **Chinook:** End of September to mid-October. They generally spawn in larger systems like the Coquitlam River.

**Coho:** Late October to mid-December. These salmon are harder to see as they like to hide and don't spawn together in large numbers.
