Wander through one of Coquitlam's fastest-growing neighbourhoods and uncover the meaning behind our murals and public art.

All In A Dream, 2025

Location: 567 Clarke Road

Artist: Diversified Brush Collective (Melissa Burgher, Joanne Dennis and Kirstin Hepburn)

Inspired by Coquitlam's mountains and skies, this vibrant mural celebrates the strength found in women supporting one another. Together, these elements represent creativity, resilience and community while bringing energy and connection to the streetscape.

Welcome Home, 2025

Location: 559 Clarke Road

Artist: Studio Huizenga

Inspired by the welcoming gesture of giving flowers, this installation features vibrant seating shaped like a vase, topped with kinetic floral sculptures that move with the wind. A colourful ground mural completes the piece, creating an inviting place to rest and enjoy the space. The bicycles in the designs are a reference to the Hobbis family, whose farm was on this site, and who established Cap's bicycle shops in the area.

Branching Out, 2016

Location: Outside of Burquitlam Station (552 Clarke Road)

Artist: Bruce Walter and YarOn Stern

Branching Out is a large-scale public art project consisting of four mosaic installations located at the plaza entrances of each Coquitlam Skytrain station. Inspired by the symbols that landscape architects use to represent trees in their drawings, the work reflects the region's natural landscape while referencing the Evergreen Extension of the Millennium Line.

Burquitlam: Between and Beyond, 2016

Location: Inside Burquitlam Station (552 Clarke Road)

Artist: Brent Bukowski

Once an outlying area between New Westminster and Port Moody, Burquitlam has become a vibrant, well-connected community through rapid transit. Created from reclaimed metal and polycarbonate, this sculpture celebrates that transformation while highlighting sustainable transportation.

They Travelled These Roads, 2016

Location: Outside of Burquitlam Station (559 Clarke Road)

Artist: Mia Weinberg

This artwork reflects the history of Burquitlam's transportation network. A circular saw blade, symbolizing the former Fraser Mills sawmill, frames the intersection of North Road and Clarke Road, where Burquitlam Station now stands, connecting the area's industrial and transportation histories.

Column Wraps, 2019

Location: Clarke Road Gateway

Artist: Challen Clark and Tracy Clark

These sculptural wraps transition from green to blue in reference to the City's signature and colours. Their shimmering colours catch the sunlight and create a sense of movement. Together, they complement the surrounding public artworks at Burquitlam Station and contribute to the area's vibrancy.
