

Coquitlam is one of the fastest-growing municipalities in British Columbia, home to more than 141,000 people. At its heart is City Centre—Coquitlam's downtown, made up of retail, office, industrial, cultural, recreational and educational services.

City Centre has seen many changes since 1979, when the Coquitlam Centre shopping centre opened and about 5,000 people lived in the area. Over the years, visionary decisions were made to group together public buildings and amenities in City Centre and create an urban downtown with high-rise and mixed-use

development.

City Centre covers 723.83 hectares (1,788.62 acres) along the boundaries of Port Moody on the west, David Avenue on the north, Westwood Street, Lincoln Avenue and the Coquitlam River on the east, and the West Coast Express railway line on the south (see map).

Today, City Centre is home to almost a quarter of Coquitlam's population (31,000-plus people). As the start of SkyTrain's Evergreen Extension to the Millennium Line, it is increasingly a hub for both the community and the region.




#### 2016 City Centre vs. Coquitlam Population by Age Group


### 2016 City Centre vs. Coquitlam Education by Degree


# 2016 Top 10 City Centre vs. Coquitlam Labour Force by Industry



### Top 10 Languages Spoken Most Often at Home










## 2006 – 2016 Languages Spoken Most Often at Home


