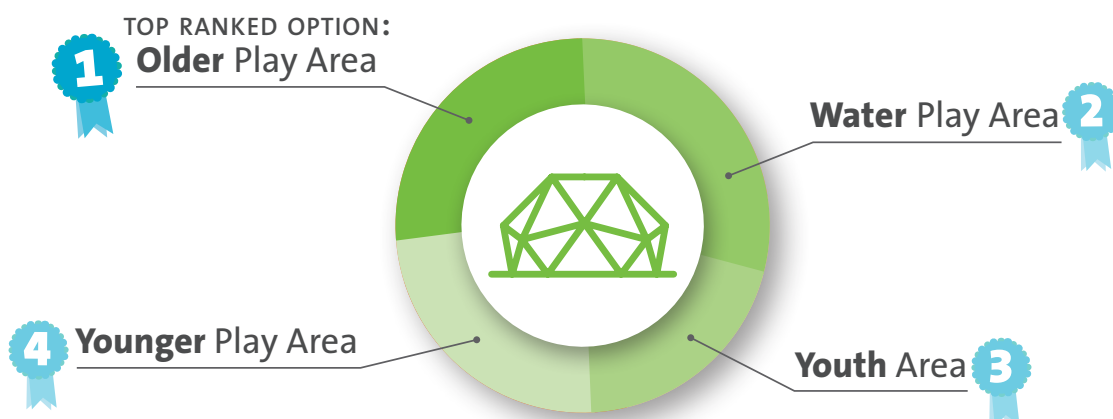
Of the 255 respondents, those with children indicated how many in each age group live in their household:

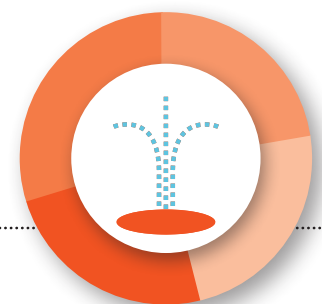
